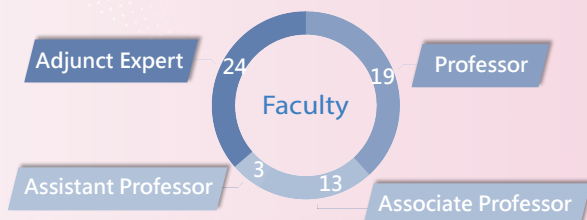

Brief Introduction

The Department was founded in 1946, and started conferring master and doctor degrees in 1959 and 1971, respectively. To date, there are more than 5,000 graduates serving the industry, research and academic establishments. The graduate program includes the divisions of Structural Mechanics, Geotechnical Engineering, Transportation Engineering, Structures and Materials, and Engineering Management.



Interdisciplinary Research

The National Center for Research on Earthquake Engineering (NCREE) constructs its new research center at Kuei-Jen Campus in NCKU. The department faculty initiated the following interdisciplinary research topics: wind electric power generation at offshore, risk assessment of nuclear power plants due to natural disasters, transportation research, structure in fire, and green roadway/green civil engineering integration to fulfill the urgent requirement of the authority.

Facilities & Equipment

The Department now has the following laboratories: Structures & Engineering Materials Lab, Soil Mechanics Lab, Bituminous Material Lab, Rock Mechanics Lab, Soil Dynamics Lab, Geosynthetics & Soil Reinforcement Lab, and Railway Engineering Lab.

Internationalization

- The Department enrolled international students in degree-seeking programs since 2007, and there are more than 100 international students graduated.
- The Department currently has over than 70 international students spanning 3 continents and 17 countries enrolled in degree-seeking programs.
